A camel is a very useful animal which is found in northern Kenya. Camels are kept by some of the nomadic people such as the Rendille, Gabbra, Somali and the Turkana. Camels can survive even in the desert areas. This is because they can eat leaves of small plants and bushes. With their long necks they can also reach the leaves of all tall trees.

When a camel has had enough to eat, some of the food is turned into fat and stored in hump. The hump becomes large and hard and may weigh upto 45 kilograms. If the camel is then taken to an area where there is no food, it can still stay alive for along period of time.

Camels can also store water inside their bodies, so they can travel for several days without drinking. The water is kept in pockets in the lining of the stomach. It is then used slowly as the body needs it. Camels do not sweat in hot weather and also they do not easily lose water from their bodies.

Camels can provide many of the things which nomadic people need. The most importa it is food. Camel milk is the main food of the people like the Gabbra and the Rendille. A female camel can give upto 2000 litres of milk a year.

The camels blood can also be used as food. The blood is taken without killing the animal. Camel meat is eaten too, but not very often. This is because the nomadic people do not like to kill their camels.
