Many people in Kenya practise farming where they grow crops such as maize, beans, onions, potatoes, bananas and other cash crops. Some also keep some domestic animals such as cows, goats, hens and sheep.

Some communities in our country are nomads, they move from place to place with their cows, goats, sheep, donkeys and camels. Mostly they live in arid and semi-arid districts in Rift valley, Eastern and North Eastern provinces. They do not plant crops because there is little rain in their areas. They move from one place to another looking for water and grass for their animals.

They build their manyattas when they find a good place and stay there until their animals have eaten all the grass. In some cases they get into trouble after crossing Kenya's boundaries.

There is a wall around the manyatta made of branches from thorn trees. In time of danger many families live together. Around the fence are houses for families and safe places for their animals. The dogs provide **security** at night.

The manyatta are often built of sticks and cowdung mixed with ashes. Skin are used for beds and are spread on the ground. They can easily be folded than other kinds of beds and carried on the backs of the donkeys or camels.

The nomads make some pots from mud and cups from wood. They use donkeys or camels to carry skins and other things. The parents and children walk on foot. Hospitals and dispensaries may be farther away than in most other places. Their way of life is moving around with their animals.
