- Jesus compared them with unfavourably with the gentiles e,g Elijah and Elisha performing miracles among the Gentiles so the Jews felt insulted.
- Jesus told them that the good news had first been offered to the Jews but because they rejected it ,it was now available to thee Gentiles.
