- After three days they found him in Jerusalem temple sitting among teachers of law listening and answering question.
- All who heard him were amazed at his understanding and answers
- His mother asked him why he treated them so he answered them that he was supposed to be in his father house, they did not understand what he said.
- They went to Nazareth with him where he grew in wisdom and stature and in the favors with God and man. (Any 7×1=7mks)

- By preaching baptism of repentance for forgiveness of sins.
- He bore witness to Jesus as the messiah and the lamb of God ,who takes away the sins of the world.
- He introduced Jesus to his disciples as the messiah.
- He acknowledged that someone greater than him was coming ,whose sandals he was not worthy to untie, he also said one who would baptize with fire and holy spirit.
- By announcing that the reign of God was near (God's reign would be brought by Jesus Christ Isaiah's prophecy Isaiah 40:3)
- He baptized Jesus so that he could begin his public ministry.

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- He lived both the world of the OT and world N.T ,he begun his ministry before and Jesus continued for sometime after Jesus had begun his public ministry .
- He was the Elijah, had all characterics of Prophet Elijah.
- Like Elijah courageously faced king Herod and condemned him for marrying his brother wife (He condemned evil) (first 7 x1=7marks)
- b. The feeding of the 5000 Luke 9: 10-17
 - After the return of the 12 disciple from their mission Jesus took them to a quite place in the town of Bethsaida.
 - A crowd of about 5000 people followed him to whom he preached about the kingdom of God.
 - The disciples requested Jesus to release the people to look for food.
 - Jesus told the disciples to give people something to eat.
 - The disciples were in dilemma because they did not have enough food to feed the people
 - Jesus told the disciples to organize the people into group of fifty.
 - He took five loaves ,two fish prayed and broke them.
 - He asked the disciple to distribute to the people.
 - The crowd ate to its full and left remains that filled 12 baskets. (any 7 × 1=7mks)

- Parables were a common methods of instruction that was used by teaches of the times of Jesus.

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- Parables were related to the people life and they could easily see the relationship between the stories and the heavily message.

- Parables sifted serious seekers of the message to causal onlookers.
