Sprinkling of blood on Israelites.

Eating of the Passover meat with the unleavened bread and bitter herbs.

The killing of Egyptian first born by angel of death.

The wailing and mourning of Egyptian due to the death of their first born sons.

The kneeling of Israelite to worship God.

The release of Israelite to worship God.

The release of Israelites by the pharaoh. Any 5 x 1= 5 marks)

b) Problems that Moses faced as he led the Israelites during the Exodus. (5 marks)

3. a) Identify six activities of king Jeroboam that made the Israelites in the northern

kingdom to turn away from God. (6 marks)

He worshipped idols.

He made golden calves/ idols and placed them at Bethel and Dan.

He made Bethel and Dan centres of worship/alternative places of worship.

He chose priests who didn't belong to the family of Levi.

He instituted religious festivals unlike those found in Judah.

He built other places of worship on hilltops/shrines.

He stopped the Israelites from going to worship in Jerusalem which was against

the law. (any 6 x 1 = 6 marks)

b) State challenges faced by Prophet Elijah in Israel. (8 marks)

There was widespread idolatry among the Israelites.

There was religious persecution/ hostility passed by Jezebel.

There was increased corruption and people had rejected the covenant way of life.

He had to face King Ahab and challenged him for misleading the people.

People were practicing syncretism.

There were many false prophets in Israel who had been brought by jezebel to promote false religion.

He had to convince the people that he was a true prophet of Yahweh.

He had to prove Yahweh as the true God by holding a contest on Mt. Carmel.

He had to endure hardships in the wilderness. (any 8 x 1 = 8 marks)

c) Give 6 teachings that Christians learn about God from Mt. Carmel contest. (6 marks)

He is more powerful/mightier than false/other gods.

(any 5x 1 = 5 marks) b) Explain five teachings of Amos' on the election of Israel. (10 marks) The Israelites were God's chosen people. God chose them to serve him. Tee were to lead holy lives. They were given special responsibilities as God's nation. They were to be the light to other nations. They were chosen for special responsibilities but not exempted from punishment if they sinned. They were chosen by God but were not superior to other nations. Despite God's favour, the Israelites rebelled and sinned against God. As God's people they had been delivered from the Egyptian bondage. They were to live according to the covenant way of life and be an example to other. Gathering/assembly of various group of people priests. Levites, children and

mothers, Ezra and Nehemiah.

Purifications ceremony-city gates, members, and walls were all purified and priests.

Formation of grand procession-all groups joined to sing led by musicians.

Divisions of people into two groups led by Ezra and another one by Nehemiah.

They continued signing as they matched round the wall.

They went round and they all came and met in the temple.

In the temple men were part of the congregation.

Festive noise, joy and celebration were heard. (any 8 x 1 = 8 marks)

c) List down five features of Nehemiah's prayer. (5 marks)

It showed a strong bond between him and the Jews.

It was characterized by confessions of sins.

It called God to hear His concern for his people and observe their suffering.

He reminded God of his promise to restore people back to their home land.

He cried to God for personal help and protection.

He also praised God for granting him success in all his endeavors. (any $5 \ge 1 = 5$ marks)

Many prefer to go to hospital for circumcision.

It is carried out at family level not community in most cases.

Female circumcisions has been outlawed.

Some communities have adopted initiation rites from others. (any 7 x 1 = 7

marks)
