- 1. a) Outline the Psalmist's prophecies about the Messiah. (9 marks)
 - He will be a royal king from birth.
 - He will conquer all the enemies of Israel through God's power.
 - · He will be betrayed by His close friend/associate
 - He will be a suffering servant of God.
 - He will be victorious at the end.
 - He would not associate with the poor, sinners and Gentiles.
 - He will sit at the right hand side of God.
 - Messiah would be a descendant of David.
 - He would come after the return of Elijah.
 - He would perform miracle.
 - He would uphold Judaism. $(9 \times 1 = 9 \text{ marks})$

b) Give six reasons why St. Lukes' Gospel is more suitable for use in the study of C.RE. (6 marks)

- He was educated and a physician.

- He worked closely with Paul.

 \cdot He emphasized more on prayers, the Holy Spirit, the role of women in the ministry of Jesus and forgiveness of sins.

- It presents Jesus as the ideal man going through all the stages of growth. (6 marks)

- To save human kind from the slavery of sin.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$ To die on the cross to pay for the wages of sin.
- To judge the world.
- To bear witness to the truth.
- To be the light of the world.
- To give food that endures/eternal life.
- To reveal God to the people.
- To give life and life in a abundant to the people.

• To enable people to worship God in truth and in the spirit. $(4 \times 2 = 8 \text{ marks})$

b) What was Jesus' response to the Pharisees' question why He and his disciples did not fast. (7 marks)

· It is not possible to make the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom was with them.

- They will fast when the bridegroom is taken away from them.
- · Jesus told them the parable of the garment and the wine skins that:
- No one takes a new patch and sew it on an old garment.
- The new patch will not match the old garment.
- The tear may become bigger after washing the garment.
- New wine should be poured in the old wineskins.
- If it is done it will burst the old wineskins and the wine will spill.
- New wine should only be put into new/ fresh wine skins
- No one after drinking old is good. $(7 \times 1 = 7 \text{ marks})$
- c) Why do people reject the good news today. (5 marks)
- They lack faith in God.
- Permissiveness in the society.
- · Desire foe worldly materials/pleasures.
- Patience is lacking in most of the people.
- Availability of so many religious/denominations which confuse people.
- True good news righteousness which many people don't want.
- Some fear the many false preachers/prophets who have risen these days.
- · Others still believe in witch doctors, magicians and sooth sayers.
- It is in fulfilment of Christ's prophecy about end time lawlessness. (5 x 1 = 5 marks)

 - The temple was a place of worship and the Israelites had defiled it.
 - The temple was the house of prayer, not business premise.
 - The money changers were dishonest and acted as robbers.
 - The people hindered the gentiles from using the temple.
 - The temple was a holy place and it was used wrongly.
 - Jesus was exercising his Messianic authority.
 - He wanted to bring a new way of worship and do away with the old Jewish religion.
 - Those doing business disrupted prayer and worship with their noise. $(6 \times 1 = 6 \text{ marks})$

 - The question about Jesus authority.

 - · Jesus warning against the teacher of the law.

c) Give reasons why some Christians are opposed to women leadership in the church today.

• The woman was the first to fall into sin in the story of Adam and Eve.

· According to the Old Testament teachings, the woman was considered ritually unclean during her monthly flow.

• Due to African/Jewish cultural influence where women were considered lesser beings.

• Due to the misinterpretation of the second account of the creation story where the woman was created after man and therefore believed to be inferior/subordinate to man/misinterpretation of the Bible.

- · God is referred to as He (man) and therefore men are held closer to him in comparison to women.
- Inability of women to carry out duties continuously due to interruptions (e.g. pregnancy/childbirth/marital obligations)
- Inability of women to work under strenuous conditions/circumstances.

· Basing on St. Paul's teaching where he says that women should be silent in church. (1 cor 14:34-36)

- The argument is based on the choosing of twelve apostle by Jesus Christ who were men.
- · Basing on Pauline teaching about the appointment of the Bishops/ deacons in the early church.
