- Perseverance in the face of persecution / those who endure suffering will receive eternal life. i
- *ii.* Unwavering faith in Jesus those who trust in God would receive great reward.
- iii. Love for enemies the spontaneous love of agape so as to look at the good side of the enemies and not the bad side.
- iv. Obedience to Jesus teaching so as to accept the Lordship of Christ.
- v. Implements of Jesus' teachings the disciples were expected to "bear good fruits".
- vi. They were to be generous those who have are expected to share with those who do not have.
- vii. They were expected to exercise self-criticism i.e. judging others / avoid hypocrisy.

5. (a) Describe the incidence when Jesus healed the centurion's servant. (7 marks)

- The centurion had a sick servant
 He was a Roman officer in charge of 100 soldiers
 The servant was sick to the point of death
 Jesus entered Capernaum and so the centurier back Jesus entered Capernaum and so, the centurion heard about him (Jesus)
- The centurion sent elders to Jesus asking him to heal his servant.
- \checkmark They pleaded with Jesus and so accepted to go with them to his house.
- ✓ Before they arrived, the centurion sent friends to tell Jesus to say a word and his servant will be healed.
- ✓ Jesus was happy with the kind of faith the centurion had.
- ✓ The servant was healed by faith.
- Narrate the feeding of the 5000men in Luke 9:10-17. (b))
 - Apostles came back and told Jesus everything they had done.
 - Jesus took them to Bathseida
 - ✓ *The crowd followed and he taught them about the kingdom of God.*
 - ✓ When the sun was beginning to set the twelve came to Jesus and told him to send the people away to the villages and farms to look for food and lodgings.
 - Jesus told them to give them food.
 - ✓ They answered they had only five loaves of bread and two fishes.
 - \checkmark He told them to make people sit in groups of fifty.
 - ✓ After this Jesus took the five loaves of bread and two fish looked to heaven thanked God
- and broke them and gave to the disciples to distribute.
 - They all ate and had enough to fill twelve baskets of what was left.

(c) Why do some Christians not believe in miracles today?

- *Difficult to distinguish genuine miracles from God.*
- Some Christians use miracles for monetary gain.
- Some use miracles to intimidate others,
- Some miracles are stage managed/take.
- ✓ Influence of science make people doubt miracles.
- ✓ Some miracle workers live very doubtful lives.
- Some miracle workers use magic/demonic powers.
- ✓ Some use miracles to attract attention/praise themselves.

 - ✓ Jesus of Nazareth was the son of God
