1. a) What were the expectations of the Jews concerning the messiah.

(7mks)

- He would rule the world as an early king.
- He would conquer nations i.e would be a military leader.
- Would be a descendent of David
- Would appear in Jerusalem full of glory.
- Would come after the return of Elijah
- Would perform miracles
- Would not associate with sinners, poor, gentiles or outcast
- He would set up a powerful kingdom for the Israelites
- Other nations would pay him homage
- He would revenge the enemies of Israel.

b) Identify what Angel Gabriel said about person and mission of John the Baptist to

Zacharia according to St Luke gospel 1; 13 – 17.

(6mks)

- He would bring Joy or gladness to many people
- He would be great before God
- Would be a Nazarite/not drink wine
- Would be filled with holy spirit
- He would reconcile the Israelite with God.
- Would bring justice
- Would prepare the people for the coming of the messiah
- Would have the spirit /power of Elijah

c) Identify ways that showed that Jesus came from a poor background.

(6mks)

- His father was a carpenter
- He was born in a manger
- His mother was an ordinary village girl
- Born in Bethlehem a small town
- The first people to see him were shepherds
- Parents sacrificed small pigeons during his dedication.
- He was presented to Simon and Anne who were simple

2. a) Describe the call of the first disciples of Jesus in accordance to Lk 5: 1 – 11

(8mks)

- Jesus was standing by the lake of Gennesaret
- He saw two boats without the fishermen
- He entered Simon's boat/ asked them to push it into the water/ cast the nets for a catch.
- Simon told Jesus that they have been fishing the whole night without success.
- He obeyed Jesus's command/let the nets down
- They caught a lot of fish/asked their partners in the other boat to assist them remove the nets.
- They filled both boats with fish/the boats began to sink

Simon peter and his companions were astonished at the miraculous catch of fish/peter asked Jesus to depart from him because he was sinful man.

b) Outline six reasons why Jesus chose the twelve disciples.

(6mks)

- In order to teach them the secrets of the kingdom of God
- To have companions/person assistant
- To form an inner group which should assist him during his public ministry.
- To be witnesses to his saving acts in the world.
- To reveal his person/give a new understanding of his messiahship.
- It symbolized the reconstruction of the twelve tribes of Israel
- To train/ prepare them for the mission after his death
- To lay a foundation for the establishment of the church.
- To continue with the biblical theme of election in which God choose anyone to serve him.

c) State six instructions given by Jesus to the twelve disciples before sending them on a mission. (8mks)

- To preach about God's Kingdom
- To perform miracles
- To have authority over demons
- To heal diseases
- To carry nothing for the journey
- Whenever house they enter they should stay and depart later
- Wherever they were not received they were to shake off dust from their feet.

3. a) Give four teaching about Jesus from the cure of the paralytic.

(8mks)

- Jesus was a teacher
- He had power of the lord to heal
- People had faith in him
- H was able to forgive sin
- He was accused of blasphemy by Jewish religious leaders
- H e had authority over sins and sickness
- He was sort by the crowd that wanted to be healed
- He had ability to percieve and know peoples thoughts
- He healed by word of mouth
- He was praised by people for his mighty deeds

b.) Identify seven teachings of Jesus in the parable of the coin and the lost sheep. (7mks)

- Jesus came to seek the lost like the good sherpherd who searchers for the lost sheep.
- God always wait for the sinners to repent
- There is joy when a sinner repents and God
- God does not want anyone to be lost
- God loves all people both righteous and the sinners
- Jesus is the light of the world and he came to save the lost in sins
- Believers have a responsibility to seek the lost and bring them back to repentance

-God is diligently searching for the lost sinner

c.) State five ways used by Christians to spread the gospel of Jesus today. (5mks)

- Use of mass media print and electronic
- Preaching in churches/ schools
- Giving tithe/offering
- Sponsoring preachers
- Writing of Biblical literature
- Composition of Songs
- Missionary activities like seminars and evangelism
- Charitable deeds visit the sick, poor orphan
- Living exemplary life/ role models.

4a) Relate the story of the widow and the unjust judge. (6mks)

- There was a judge who neither feared God nor regarded man.
- There was a widow who kept on coming to the judge to settle a case between her and her enemies/adversaries
- The judge of first refused to grant the widow's request
- The widow did not give up/ she persisted on her request
- The judge finally accepted to grant the widow her request.
- Jesus said that God would vindicate/ grant the request of those who pray to him persistently
- Jesus said that God responds to these who pray to him in faith speedily

b) Give eight reasons why Jesus used parables in his teaching. (7mks)

- To explain unfamiliar messages to his listeners in order to understand
- It was a popular method of teaching during that time
- To provoke his listeners into critical thinking
- To Identify the people who were serious seekers for God's kingdom
- To avoid direct conflicts with the Jewish leaders
- To challenge his listeners and stimulate their imaginations
- To make his listeners remember what they were taught for along time
- To attract the interest of the listener to avoid boredom
- To enhance the listeners desire and ability to meditate over the teachings and apply them in their lives.

c) State six actions of Jesus which showed he loved the needy. (6mks)

- He called ordinarily people to be his disciples
- He healed the sick
- He fed the hungry
- He died for sinners
- He preached the good news
- He restored the rejected
- He forgave sinners.

5. Narrate Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem before his arrest Lk 19 ; 28 – 40 (8mks)

- When Jesus was near Jerusalem he sent two of his disciples to the village

- The disciples were to find a colt tied on which no one had ridden
- They were to untie the colt and bring it to him
- If asked why they were untying there should say the master needs it
- When disciples went they found the colt as Jesus had said
- When the owners saw them untie the colt the disciple answer the master needs it
- Jesus ride on their colt as he entered Jerusalem
- The people laid their clothes and palm leaves on the path Jesus passed.
- The Pharisees in the crowd told Jesus to silence the crowd for this would seem an incitement against Roman authority
- Jesus did not stop them from declaring that he was the messiah king

b) Give six reasons that made Judas Iscariot betray Jesus.

(6mks)

- He was looking for recognition / fame
- Greed for money
- He was tempted by satan
- He was unhappy with Jesus activities
- He was an informer of the Jewish religious leaders
- He was expecting a political messiah not a spiritual messiah
- To fulfill the old testament scripture that one of the close friend will betray him

c) Identify 6 occasions when Jesus prayed as recorded in st Luke gospel.

(6mks)

- During his baptism
- Temptation in the wilderness
- Before choosing 12 disciples
- In the miracle of feeding 5,000
- During transfiguration
- Before teaching his disciples how to pray.
- After the return of the 72 disciples from their mission
- At Mt olives before his arrest
- During last supper
- When on the cross
- After his resurrection at the house of cleopas at Emmaus

6.a) Explain the teachings of Jesus on the unity of believers as illustrated in the vine and branches

(6mks)

- God is the dresser
- Jesus is the true vine
- The followers of Jesus/ Christian are the branches
- Christians are related to God through Jesus
- The unfaithful Christians are unfruitful branches which are cut off pruned.
- Christian can bear fruits if they remain in Christ.
- Through Christ all Christians are joined to one another
- The follower of Christ should observe keep God's commandments
- Christians should rely on Gods providence

- Christians misuse the gift of prophecy by giving wrong information
- Some Christians may impart demonic powers on the innocent/ignorant as they claim to perform miracle.
- Some Christians who posses the gift or the holy spirit develop pride/arrogance.
- Some use the gift to bring division in the church/ creating splinter groups
- Some Christians refuse to utilize the gifts they posses/personalize the gifts.
